18TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME OF THE YEAR A

Readings: Isaiah 55: 1-3, Rom. 8:35, 37-39, Matt. 14:13-21

Theme: Bring what you have (talents/charism/gifts, wealth, health, etc.) so that Jesus can multiply it for the good of others.

In today's gospel periscope, Jesus is presented as the new Moses who feeds the human community with new food. The new food is above all the banquet of God's word prepared and served in a unique way. The crowd enjoyed the Lord's presence to such a degree that it did not notice the setting of the sun. Jesus the light and sun of justice was the light of the crowd. For those who dwell in the Lord's Light, there is no sunset.

The hesitation and excuse of the disciples demonstrate that what often lacks is not bread to break and distribute but what often lacks is "enough" willingness, readiness and even the heart to share what is there. The real miracle in the account of Matthew is the multiplication of the faith of the wearied crowd and hesitating disciples. When the Lord multiplied the loaves and fish, he multiplied the little faith of the disciples in God who realizes great things from what man considers insignificant.

Secondly, the boy in the gospel gave what he had to Jesus. And Jesus shared the boy's gift with thousands. Therefore, the central message I would like us to share from this gospel is this: one person like one grain of wheat can be the instrument of miracle. One concerned person can change the lives of many if the person says YES to Jesus. Any gift/charism/talent etcetera we have can go a long way to helping others if we agree to use it. This is evident in the life testimony of a British TV celebrity Malcolm Muggeridge who became a Catholic after an encounter with Mother Teresa of Calcutta. He said: "Words cannot express how much I owe her. She showed me Christianity in action. She showed me the power of love. She showed me how one loving person can start a tidal wave of love that can spread to the entire world".

The good news of today's gospel is that a single person is important; if anyone shares what he or she has (gifts, wealth, talent, etc.) with Jesus, he can make it bear fruit beyond our widest dream in a miraculous way. Therefore, do not say that you don't have anything to offer, don't say that you are useless, don't say that you don't have the power to do anything, and don't say that what you have is too small to start. Jesus is calling us today to approach him with our talent or gift. Remember the poem by Amado Nervo, the great Mexican poet and mystic. It sums up the message of today: "I am only a spark - make me a fire, I am only a string - make me a lyre, I am only an ant-hill - make me a mountain, etc. **Jesus loves you and so do I. Rev. St. Francis De Paula Sunday mass celebrations will begin indoors Sat. 5:30 pm and Sunday 11:30 am with minimum 25% attendance approximately 60 persons including Ministers. **Every other pew** will have a **minimum of 3 persons** per pew with the exception of family members from the same household.
