15th Sunday in Ordinary time of the year C

Readings:

(Deuteronomy 30: 10-14). Moses encourages the Hebrew people to obey faithfully the commandments that God has given to them. These commandments are centred on love of God and neighbours.

(Col. 1:15-20). The hymn here celebrates the primacy of Jesus our Lord over all creation because of His faithfulness in keeping the law of God the father.

(Gospel of Luke 10: 25-37). In order to remind them the importance of keeping the commandments of God, Jesus told his followers the parable of the 'Good Samaritan'.

Theme: Good Samaritan: an embodiment of faith and good works.

Any person can be a victim of social, spiritual, and material robbery. The man who went down from Jerusalem to Jericho is an example of this: spiritually, Jerusalem is metaphorically noted in the scriptures as the place of peace, love, holiness, and mercy while Jericho is quite the opposite. Thus, every kind of evil is said to be happening there. (For example; the wall of Jericho Joshua 6:1-27, Heb. 11:30, the blind man of Jericho Lk.18:35, Mk. 10:46-52, Mtt.9:27-31, the Harlot of Jericho Joshua 6:25-ff).

St. Luke reports: "A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands..." (verse 30). In Luke's gospel, Jerusalem is a key place where the drama of salvation was displayed to a happy conclusion. The Lord's ministry, attention, and concern were always focused on Jerusalem. For Luke's audience, all roads lead to Jerusalem too. Jericho, on the contrary, was a dangerous city where all manners of crime were possible. 'To live in Jericho', is 'to live like people of Jericho' while 'to live in Jerusalem is to live and maintain our baptismal vows in Christ; to keep the commandments: to love God and our neighbour'.

The last question of Jesus and the young man's answer is very interesting, "...among those people who saw the victim, who was the victim's neighbour...? After giving his answer, Jesus asked him to go and do the same.

Therefore, in the Eucharist we will meet the Good Samaritan himself – our Lord Jesus Christ. He rescues our wounded humanity and bandages our wounded hearts. May he continue to teach us how to live a very true life of Christ. **Rev. Marcel Okonkwo.**
